In Fall 2006 the CSUEB History Department will begin offering the History Major and Minor and the History Option in Liberal Studies at the Concord Campus.

History majors graduate with the ability to analyze complex problems, communicate effectively both in written and oral form, and understand diverse peoples in widely different circumstances and time periods. As expressed in the History Department Mission Statement, "a significant portion of the department's graduates will enter the teaching profession, but all who complete its programs should be equipped to approach knowledgeably, sensitively, and critically whatever careers they choose."

Students who major in history also seek careers or further graduate training as researchers, librarians, attorneys, journalists, museum curators, preservationists, and in publishing, politics, public administration, and other government service, among many possibilities.

SCHEDULING

Majors, Minors, and History Option students will be able to complete their upper division work in a two-year period. Required courses will be offered during evening hours; concentration and elective courses will be offered during the day and evening.

APPLICATION

The Concord Campus operates on the quarter system with four quarters a year. Applications are accepted every quarter. Applicants who want to enroll at the Concord Campus must be eligible for admission as an upper division student. Upper division and graduate courses only are offered at the Concord Campus.

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

The History Major consists of 60 units for students under the CSUEB Catalog through 2004-05; and 68 units (including HIST 1101 and 1102) for students under the CSUEB Catalog as of 2005-06. See the university catalog for additional information. HIST 3400 may not be counted toward the Major.

I. Core Curriculum (24 units)

A. Lower Division Foundation Courses

The following courses should be taken as early in the major as possible at the Hayward campus or as equivalent courses at a community college.

- HIST 1000 or 2010 Introduction to History (4) (or substitution of 3000-level course in History)
- HIST 1014 World Civilizations I (4)
- HIST 1015 World Civilizations II (4)
- HIST 1016 World Civilizations III (4)
- HIST 1101 (US to 1877) (as of CSUEB 2005-06 Catalog)
- HIST 1102 (US since 1877) (as of CSUEB 2005-06 Catalog)

B. Upper Division Skills and Capstone Courses (12 units)

- HIST 3010 Historical Writing (4) (offered every other year) (prerequisite = HIST 1000 or 2010 or 3000-level History course)
- HIST 4030 Historiography (4) (offered every other year) (prerequisites = HIST 1014, 1015, 1016, 3010)
- HIST 4031 Historical Research Methods (4) (offered every other year) (prerequisites = HIST 1014, 1015, 1016, 3010)

II. Upper Division Concentration Requirements (16 units)

Majors should choose one of the following two concentrations, either United States History or California and the American West (offered in a two-year cycle at Concord).

A. United States History

1. Two courses (8 units) from the following: HIST 3411, 3412, 3413, 3414, 3415, 3416, 3417
2. Two courses (8 units) from the following: HIST 3500, 3503, 3505, 3511, 3515, 3520, 3530, 3540, 3547, 3550, 3567, 3568, 3571, 3575, 3802

B. History of California and the American West

1. HIST 3500, 3511 (8) (if 3500 used for 1000/2010, substitute with another 3000-level from #2)
2. Two courses (8 units) from the following: HIST 3503, 3505, 3515, 3530, 4032

III. Upper Division Electives (16 units)

Majors must complete four additional upper division courses (16 units) in History. At least two of these courses (8 units) must be from areas outside the student's concentration. Please note that California & the American West is considered to be a separate concentration area from U.S. History despite overlapping courses.

THE HISTORY MINOR (36 Units)

The History Minor is ideal for students in other disciplines who want to hone their writing and research skills, or who simply want more history. HIST 3400 may not be counted towards the Minor.

I. Lower Division (16 units)

The following courses should be taken as early in the minor as possible at the Hayward campus or as equivalent courses at a community college.

HIST 1000 or 2010 Introduction to History (4) (or substitution of 3000-level course)

HIST 1014 World Civilizations I (4)

HIST 1015 World Civilizations II (4)

HIST 1016 World Civilizations III (4)

II. Upper Division (20 units)

The following courses may be completed at the Concord campus in one year or in a two-year cycle.

A. HIST 3010 Historical Writing (4)

B. Area Requirements (12 units)

A minimum of four units of upper division History courses in each of the following areas:

- (1) Europe
- (2) United States
- (3) Latin America or Asia

C. Capstone Course (4 units)

One of the following:

HIST 4030 Historiography (4)

HIST 4031 Historical Research Methods (4)

THE HISTORY OPTION IN LIBERAL STUDIES (20 Units)

The History Option courses have been revised. The following new courses are recommended (and required as of the 2007-2008 catalog year).

HIST 1000 or 2010 (or substitution of 3000-level course in History)

HIST 3010 Historical Writing

Three additional upper division courses in History from at least two of the following fields: the United States, Europe, Latin America, and/or Asia.
