The **Liberal Studies major** aims to provide a rich educational experience through coursework in a broad range of academic disciplines. The broad-based, interdisciplinary nature of Liberal Studies provides a knowledge base and communication and analytical skills appropriate to many careers and occupations. It provides a broad exposure to the arts, humanities, sciences, and social science fields that comprise a true liberal education. Hence, the Liberal Studies major is excellent preparation not only for teaching, but for graduate work, law school, and employment in business and government.

The Liberal Studies major may be completed by taking day and/or evening courses. Courses are scheduled to allow a student to complete the upper division portion of the Liberal studies major in a two year period.
