**Public Administration** is a rich and challenging multi-disciplinary field drawing from sociology, anthropology, philosophy, psychology, economics, and urban and organizational studies. The master's degree program provides students with a grounding in major philosophical and social science thinking about the nature of organizations; it helps students build the intellectual and practical tools they will need to become effective organizational leaders in the public and non-profit sectors. The M.P.A. program is designed to increase the personal and professional effectiveness of people working in public, voluntary, and private organizations. The program's purpose is to prepare individuals for leadership positions in a variety of organizations with a sense of commitment to social purpose, the public interest, and effective public problem-solving.

### SCHEDULING

The M.P.A. is an evening and Saturday program with two courses scheduled each quarter to enable students to graduate in about two years (eight quarters). Students who would like to complete the program entirely at the Concord Campus need to begin the program in Fall 2007 and continue with the "cohort" for eight consecutive quarters. (See 2007-2009 schedule on reverse side.)

### REQUIREMENTS

The MPA is a 48 quarter unit program consisting of a graduate core, an option area, and a capstone course or thesis, building on four foundation courses. The MPA Program offers five options at the Hayward campus; only the Public Management Option is entirely available at the Concord Campus. Students who wish to take a different option or to develop a more specialized program will need to take courses at the Hayward campus.

## ADDITIONAL DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

- Of the 48 quarter units required for the MPA, 35 must be completed in residence at the University.
- All 48 units must be earned within the five years preceding the completion of the requirements for the degree.

For students who did not complete their undergraduate degrees from any California State University campus, you are required to pass the Writing Skills Test. Students must take the test during their first quarter of attendance after being admitted to the MPA program.

Each MPA student is required to complete a basic statistics course (e.g., Elements of Probability and Statistics; STAT 1000 or its equivalent). Please note that if a related statistics course had been taken within the past 5 years, this course may be waived, if so, contact the MPA Graduate Coordinator, or the Department Chair.

Before starting graduate core courses, students must satisfactorily complete the four foundation courses and be admitted to the M.P.A. program.

## APPLICATION

Admission requirements include:

- a baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution
- an overall grade point average of 3.0 in the last 90 quarter/60 semester units
- a statement of purpose stating reasons for wanting to pursue the MPA degree\*
- two letters of recommendation\*
- a resume\*

The Concord Campus operates on the quarter system with four quarters a year of approximately ten weeks each. Students are admitted to the MPA Program every quarter; however, because of sequencing of courses, students wishing to take all courses at the Concord Campus will need to begin the program in Fall 2006.
